HONORS AND AWARDS

The AHA presents several awards to outstanding horticulturists. The Awards committee reviews the nominations and recommends candidates to the Board of Directors.

THESE AWARDS ARE:

Honorary Life Membership

An award to present and past members of the AHA based on the individual's personal service and contribution to the AHA and its objectives.

Centennial Gold Medal

This is an infrequent award that recognizes outstanding individuals or corporate contributions to horticulture in broad terms such as the commercial industry in Alberta and beyond.

Community Gardener Award

The AHA recognizes the contribution of a multitude of enthusiastic home gardeners all around the province. The AHA's Community Gardener Award is a small but tangible way to recognize the contributions of individuals who contribute significantly to their communities in this way. CONFERENCE

Our annual conference is one of the major activities of the Association. This function is held every year and it provides an exciting opportunity for everyone to increase their horticultural skills and to share ideas.
