The original Pegg family homestead is a designated provincial historic resource, open to the public to learn about the work of George Pegg. An amateur botanist, George contributed to the record of Alberta's native plants. His plant specimens form part of the herbarium collections at the University of Alberta,

Royal Alberta Museum, and Central Experimental Farm in Ottawa. George also recorded weather data for Environment Canada for almost 30 years. George's original garden is the centrepiece of this 12 acre site. The site also includes the log house where George lived with his parents and seven siblings through the early 20th century, an unusual 8-sided granary, and several other farm buildings. Visitor amenities include a nature trail, picnic tables, and wheelchair accessible washrooms. Family oriented special events are held throughout the summer and staff lead guided tours. The site is available for weddings, group tours, and photography sessions.
